
### And in the morning by John Wilson

Jim Hay is fifteen and thinks war is a glorious adventure. What he discovers in the trenches of France is enough to dispel any romantic view of war.




# The first stone by Don Aker 2004 WINNER

Every year the students of Saskatoon Collegiate hold their breath until the winner of the lottery is announced. For that person, it will be a life changing event.




### No escape by Norah McClintock


### Shoulder the sky by Lesley Choyce


#### Skud by Dennis Foon
